The usual annual donation of some valuable books of Biography and travel. (The extent and value of these gifts from Yale University deserve to be most cordially acknowledged.)

Though there has been no great activity in the publishing business and some purchases have been made of complete collections, the necessary works of current literature, of interest in the Library, have been procured.

All the more authoritative histories of the war have been purchased. All the volumes of popular description or personal narrative have been obtained. And special pains have been taken to procure all the law-books relating to the war and all the Diplomatic papers and correspondence of the Allies and of the United States. These have been obtained in sufficient numbers to be of immediate use at any time to Members.

Purchase has also been made in Paris of the following valuable periodicals:—

*Revue des Deux Mondes*, 570 vols.

*Le Correspondant*, 172 vols.

And we have reason to expect that the Government of the French Republic will donate fifty years' issues of the *Journal Officiel*, and invaluable repertory of the official history of the nation.
