The Order being read for the second reading of Bill No. C-24, An Act to amend the Indian Act;

Mr. Hees, for Mrs. Fairclough, seconded by Mr. Hamilton (Qu'Appelle), moved,—That the said Bill be now read a second time.

After debate thereon, the question being put on the said motion, it was agreed to.

The said Bill was accordingly read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, and reported without amendment.

By unanimous consent, the said Bill was read the third time and passed.

The Order being read for the second reading of Bill No. C-21, An Act to amend the Penitentiary Act;

Mr. Hees, for Mr. Fulton, seconded by Mr. Hamilton (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce), moved,—That the said Bill be now read a second time.

After debate thereon, the question being put on the said motion, it was agreed to.

The said Bill was accordingly read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, and reported without amendment.

By unanimous consent, the said Bill was read the third time and passed.

The Order being read for the second reading of Bill No. S-9, An Act to amend the Criminal Code;

Mr. Fulton, seconded by Mrs. Fairclough, moved,—That the said Bill be now read a second time.

After debate thereon, the question being put on the said motion, it was agreed to.

The said Bill was accordingly read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, and reported without amendment.

By unanimous consent, the said Bill was read the third time and passed.

The House resolved itself into Committee of the Whole to consider a certain proposed resolution to establish the National Parole Board.

(In the Committee)

The following resolution was adopted:

Resolved,—That it is expedient to introduce a measure to establish a board to be known as the National Parole Board; to provide for the remuneration and expenses of the members of the Board; for the appointment of the officers, clerks and employees necessary for the proper conduct of the business of the Board; to provide generally for the administration of the Act; and further for the repeal of the Ticket of Leave Act.
