DAIRYING—PAYMENTS TO PRODUCERS TO CURTAIL PRODUCTION

Mr. H. W. Danforth (Kent-Essex): A supplementary question, Mr. Speaker. In view of the serious problem of overproduction in the dairy industry, is the government going to follow a policy for that industry similar to the policy of payment for not planting as announced for wheat producers and initiate payments to dairy producers, to curtail production instead of letting the dairy industry suffer the present penalties for overproduction?

Olson (Minister of Agriculture): Mr. Speaker, the Canadian Dairy Commission and the Department of Agriculture are completing their discussions with the various marketing industries in the provinces as well as with Dairy Producer Representatives to find a better way of keeping production and consumption in balance.

Mr. Baldwin: No doubt so that the minister need not make a statement.

Mr. A. P. Gleave (Saskatoon-Biggar): A supplementary question, Mr. Speaker. Is the government going to give the \$10 million to the dairy producers on condition that they do not milk their cows?

FINAL PAYMENT ON DURUM WHEAT

Mr. Jack McIntosh (Swift Current-Maple Creek): Mr. Speaker, may I direct a question to the Minister without Portfolio who answers for the Wheat Board. Because of the concern of the Durum wheat producers of western Canada, will the minister inform the House if it has been decided that the board will make a final payment to the producers from the surplus now in the Durum wheat account?

Hon. Otto E. Lang (Minister without Portfolio): Yes, Mr. Speaker. The estimates tabled earlier today show that the government proposes to allow a sufficient amount to make up the deficit in the wheat, oats and barley accounts in last year's pool in such a way that the surplus which has accumulated to the Durum account will be payable to the Durum producers.

Mr. A. B. Douglas (Assiniboia): A supplementary question, Mr. Speaker. Can the minister advise whether the amount of money available for the Durum wheat producers will be the \$6 million the producers are expecting.

Mr. Lang: Mr. Speaker, it should be in that order or perhaps a little more.

An hon. Member: Should it not be \$48 million?
