Mr. Wilson (Etobicoke Centre): We have maintained the full indexation of the guaranteed income supplement in place, and the payments to veterans and the child tax credit will be increasing in excess of inflation over the next three years. We have committed to put in place a minimum tax for the next taxation year. There is a wide range of matters here which direct themselves to the question of fairness, and I believe Canadians support that.

ALLEGED DECLARATION BY PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARY— GOVERNMENT POSITION

Mr. Jean-Claude Malépart (Montreal-Sainte-Marie): Mr. Speaker, my question is directed to the Prime Minister. Yesterday we proved that you did not honour your solemn commitment towards elderly Canadians.

Here is what the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of National Health and Welfare said, as reported today in the newspaper *La Presse*:

-the Mulroney Government does not have to keep last summers's election campaign promise to index old age security pensions.

Here is my question to the Prime Minister. Does the statement made by the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of National Health and Welfare represent the position of the Prime Minister and the Government?

Right Hon. Brian Mulroney (Prime Minister): Mr. Speaker, I think that the position . . . The Hon. Member is not in the House today.

Mr. Rossi: They hid her!

Mr. Mulroney: On the contrary! The Hon. Member for Bourassa said that we hid her. She is one of Quebec's most distinguished women, one of our outstanding Quebecers and we want her to be constantly in the limelight. The name Bertrand commands pride. She did not say she was speaking on behalf of the Government. The Minister of Finance and the Minister of National Health and Welfare have been the Government's spokesmen, and I should think that was obvious enough.

FULL INDEXATION OF OLD AGE PENSIONS—GOVERNMENT POSITION

Mr. Jean-Claude Malépart (Montreal-Sainte-Marie): Mr. Speaker, just to make sure that the Right Hon. the Prime Minister is as good as his word, would he now agree to ask the Minister of Finance to reinstate full old age security pension indexation, as promised in Sherbrooke on July 26, particularly
