# SCRUTINY OF REGULATIONS

#### EIGHTH REPORT OF STANDING JOINT COMMITTEE

Mr. Derek Lee (Scarborough-Rouge River): Madam Speaker, I have the honour to table the eighth report of the Standing Joint Committee on Scrutiny of Regulations.

#### **Routine Proceedings**

In this report the joint committee draws the attention of the Houses to regulations which the committee believes to be *ultra vires* of the act, that is regulations made without jurisdiction. The alleged defects were caused, it appears, by ambiguity in the English version of section 23(d) of the Territorial Lands Act. The ambiguity does not exist in the French version.

The report recommends that the government introduce a legislative amendment to clarify the scope of the power delegated by section 23(d) and it includes a request for the tabling of a comprehensive report by the government. Until that occurs the government should be cautious in using or relying on these particular regulations.
