

No. 3. By the Honourable Mr. Landry:—

November 27—That he will inquire of the Government—

1. To whom, where and when were the workshops for repairing locomotives at Hadlow Cove, Lévis, sold?

2. Were there tenders for the purchase or the pulling down of these workshops?

3. What was the price paid?

4. How much freight do the purchasers pay on the materials to transport them from Lévis to St. Romuald or elsewhere?

5. Is it to the knowledge of the Government that a Member of Parliament has bought, or obtained from the contractors who are demolishing these workshops, a part of the woodwork in order to build stores upon his properties?

6. What price did this Member of Parliament pay to the Intercolonial Railway for the transportation of these materials from Hadlow Cove to Lévis?

No. 4. By the Honourable Mr. Landry:—

November 27—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General; praying that His Excellency will be pleased to cause to be laid before this House a copy of all the correspondence exchanged between the Department of Marine and Fisheries or any person or any company whatsoever on the subject of the stranding at Matane of the steamer *Kensington*, as well as of the inquiry which has been made into this subject, and of the judgment rendered by the commissioner making the inquiry.
