be quite impossible to carry on investigations in many fields of electrical and magnetic research.

I do not know that I should touch upon this matter so far as it affects the present Physics Building, since this is on the Campus and not on University Street, and is furthermore, I understand, being made the subject of a statement addressed to you by Dr. Eve. Since, however, it has been repeatedly suggested that the present Physics Building must, as years go on, be extended to University Street in order to accommodate the increasing number of students, I have consulted Professor Eve with reference to this suggestion and find that it is his opinion that in such an extension it would be impossible to give advanced instruction or to carry on research in many important departments of his subject.
