the Rectory. Here I took the train for King's Cross, which we reached about 1 o'clock.

Tuesday, November 1.—Several letters containing subscriptions awaited me. Received a very kind letter from the Rev. Dr. Harris, formerly of Upper Canada College, offering me three churches for collections in Torquay, on Sunday, the 13th of November, which I accepted.

Went to 67, Lincoln's Inn Fields, to see the Secretary relative to the grant of £500 from the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge. It was arranged that it should be drawn for as soon as we were ready to invest it securely, as an endowment, for the College.

Accompanied Mr. Street to Epsom to take a parting dinner with Mr. and Mrs. Robert Gillespie, and remained all night.

Wednesday, November 2.—Engaged all the morning replying to letters which enclosed subscriptions. Went with Mr. Street to a farewell dinner with Henry Hoare, Esq., and Lady Mary.

Thursday, November 3.—Received several subscriptions, and a note from Miss Champion, enclosing a donation of £20.

Friday, November 4.—Engaged all the morning in answering letters. Received an invitation from Sir Fitzroy and Lady Kelly, to meet the celebrated Berryer at dinner, with a few distinguished guests. Invited to a parting dinner at Col. Graham's, where I met Sir John Mellor, one of the Judges of the Queen's Bench, and Lady Mellor, General and Mrs. Walker, and Col. Ross.

Sunday, November 6.—Went with Mr. Street to St. Andrew's Church, Wells Street, where I preached in behalf of the Trinity College, by the kind permission of the excellent Incumbent, the Rev. B. Webb. The collection, which was the usual Sunday offering, amounted to £15.

Had the honour of dining at Sir Fitzroy Kelley's with the world-renowned Berryer and some of the most distinguished men in England. Amongst the guests were His Grace, the Duke of Wellington, Lord Brougham, Lord St. Leonards, the Lord Chief Baron, the Right Hon. Sir Frederic J. Pollock, the Right Hon. Sir J. L.
