A PROCLAMATION.



T being absolutely necessary in the present Diforders, to provide in the most effectual Manner for the Defense of the Town and Province of *Quebec*: And whereas great Affistance may be derived from the Sailors on Board the Ships and Vessels in the different Parts of the Province,

It is hereby Ordered that no Ship or Vessel now in any Port of the Province, or that shall come into any Port of the Province, do proceed in her Voyage to *England*, or elsewhere, before the Twentieth Day of October next; and the Officers employed in the Collection of His Majesty's Customs are hereby commanded to suffer no Ship to clear out till the aforesaid Time.

GIVE N under my Hand and Scal at Arms at Quebec, this 28th Day of September, in Fifteenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, and in the Year of our Lord, 1775.
