THE ARKANSAS KOHINOOR.

Evidently the possibilities of the Arkansas diamond fields are to be taken much more seriously than heretofore.

The reported discovery in Pike County, in that state of a stone as remarkable for its quality as for its size holds out great promise to future exploration.

The finding of a \$6000 nugget in a locality in which gold was already known to exist in some quantities would be certain to start a rush of prospectors to the region. Probably the discovery of this \$6000 diamond will furnish incentive for the most thorough investigation so far made of the Arkansas diamond workings. This will be of advantage, provided prospectors spend their own money. I am asked to invest in get-rich-quick schemes based on exaggerated estimates of the opportunity in the Arkansas fields, those who cannot afford to lose their money should remember that diamonds have also been found in Rutherford, County, N.C., in Hale County, Ga., and in other places in America, as well as in Arkansas. No great fortunes have yet been accumulated from diamond mining in the United States—St. Louis Republic.
