

GRAIN PRICES ARE LOWER

Clearer Weather Brings Distinct Weakness at Chicago in Corn and Wheat.

LIVERPOOL PRICES ARE EASIER

Wheat Movement Liberal, Says Modern Miller-Gossip and Quotations.

World Office, Friday Evening, Sept. 18.

Liverpool wheat futures closed 3/4 lower than yesterday, and corn futures 1/2 lower.

At Chicago December wheat closed 1/2 lower and December corn 1/2 lower.

Car lots at Chicago today: Wheat 82, corn 42, oats 107.

Northwest receipts of wheat to-day: Duluth 250, against 121 last week and 439 last year.

Minneapolis 478, against 408 last week and 443 last year.

Friday receipts of wheat to-day: 1,067,000 bushels, shipments 1,035,000.

Corn receipts to-day: 710,000 bushels, shipments 670,000.

Chicago, Sept. 18. The buying of wheat and corn on the break looks better than the selling.

Chicago crop reports gathered by St. Louis office of Standard Pacific and forwarded to George Goad in New York do not indicate that corn along company's lines has suffered material damage from frosts.

Chicago: Clear with slowly rising temperature everywhere. No rain. Frosts in Illinois, Iowa, Ohio, Indiana, Kansas and Missouri. Light frost in Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma, Kan. Temperature: Northwest, 20 to 44; Nebraska, Illinois and Iowa, 26 to 32; Northwest, 40 to 52.

St. Louis, Mo.: The Modern Miller says: "Movement continues liberal of winter wheat from the southwest and west, principally of hard winter, but is small from other sections. Quality of Nebraska crop further lowered by too much moisture and unfavorable weather. Rain here falls in sections where fall plowing is being delayed by dry weather."

Monday's Indian wheat shipments, 1,016,000 bushels.

Friday's Argentine wheat shipments, 298,000 bushels; maize, 3,304,000 bushels.

Argentine wheat weather has been measurably warm; no damage has yet been done by locusts.

The weekly crop report to Dun's Review from branches of R. G. Dun & Co. in leading crop states is not so favorable to corn and cotton. A considerable part of the corn crop in important sections of the west has not yet reached maturity, and the weather and frost of the week, extending as far south as Kansas, threatens serious damage. Reports are conflicting regarding the outlook, but serious loss has been suffered in Northern Nebraska and Iowa and along the whole northern border.

St. Lawrence Market.

Receipts of farm produce were 4600 bushels of grain, 30 loads of hay, 3 loads of straw, a few dressed hogs and several loads of potatoes and a fair supply of poultry.

Wheat—Even hundred bushels sold at 30 to 31; 500 bushels of white at 31 to 32; 200 bushels of red at 31 to 32; 100 bushels of No. 1 at 31 to 32; 50 bushels at 31 to 32.

Barley—Two thousand bushels sold at 41 to 42.

Oats—Even hundred bushels sold at 24 to 25.

Hay—Thirty loads sold at \$10 to \$11 per ton.

Dressed hogs—Prices ranged from \$7 to \$8 per cwt. The bulk of sales being at \$8 per cwt.

Poultry—Spring chickens were unchanged from quotations given in table.

Butter—Even hundred bushels sold at 90 to 95 per lb. live weight, or 11 to 12 1/2 per lb. dressed.

Ducks sold at 10c per lb. live weight and 12c per lb. dressed.

Turkeys are scarce and sold at 18c per lb. dressed for the best of good quality.

Brown Bros. bought 16 pairs of live chickens at 9c per lb. live weight. These when dressed averaged 12c per pair, and were of choice quality.
