## LOVE AND ESPIONAGE

Woman Uses Her Beauty To Obtain German Naval Secrets.

## London, July 14.—What is believed to have been an attempt to obtain the secret of the composition of the new German smokeless powder for the French Government has been frustrated by the Kiel police, and on Wednesday two suspected persons were brought before a court-martial on a charge of treason.

The prisoners are Fraulein Petersen, of Hamburg, a handsome woman, who gives her age as 44, though she looks no more than 25, and a warrant officer, named Dietrich, connected with the German explosives department.

Petersen, whose parents conduct a humble restaurant in Hamburg, has been living in Kiel for some time as a teacher of languages. She made her home with the widow of a German naval captain, and through her introduction got to know Dietrich.

The young man became infatuated with the handsome teacher, and it is alleged that she deliberately encouraged his advances in order to obtain the secret information she desired. So that she might meet Dietrich untroubled, she left the widow's house, and took apartments on her own account.

Her late landlady, who kept up an acquaintance with Petersen, was struck by the frequent visits of Dietrich, and also by the fact that the woman's dress and mode of living were quite out of proportion to the earnings she was supposed to get as a teacher.

Then the widow, becoming inquisitive, found that Dietrich occasionally brought home a young woman, and papers for his sweetheart, to look over. She therefore conveyed her suspicions to the police.

## LAMED THE CORPSE

Cuts Sinews of Foot to Prevent Ghost From Wandering.

London, July 13.—The Pall Mall Gazette's Trieste correspondent sends an account of a strange case illustrative of the superstitions current in Dalmatia. Antonia Iagis, a widow, was accused of mutilating a corpse, and also with disturbing the repose of the dead, by severing the sinews in the foot of Mathe Duda, a deceased land owner, at Sanona, near Spalato.

It seems that in this locality exists a deeply-rooted superstition that any evildoer will after death be compelled to wander about eternally in the shape of a greatly distended spirit, to the terror and discomfort of himself and all beholders. And as Duda's daughter-in-law had reason for fearing that he might become a "Bukodlak," as the Dalmatian vernacular has it, she employed the widow to cut the ligaments in one foot and thus prevent any ghostly ramblings later.

The lower court discharged the prisoner because she was convinced of the truth of the superstitions and had acted from motives of piety, but the court of appeal reversed the decision and sentenced her to three days' imprisonment for mistreatment of a corpse.

## RAMPOLLA COLLAPSES

The Celebrated Cardinal Ordered to Switzerland to Recuperate.

Rome, July 13.—Cardinal Rampolla, former secretary of state to Pope Leo XIII, is in a serious condition, owing to overwork. His nervous system has suffered a complete breakdown, and on the orders of his physicians he will go to Switzerland to recuperate.

Cardinal Rampolla was one of the strong candidates for the papacy at the time Pope Pius X. was elected. Only recently have the relations between him and the Pope become really cordial.

Cardinal Rampolla, Marquis del Tiro, is said to have been the dead Pontiff's choice as his successor. He is one of the very few Italian members of the sacred college who are of patriotic birth.

Rampolla has lived in profound retirement since the death of the late Pope. He resides in the palace of St. Martha, just behind St. Peter's, a square and unpretentious two-story building, a palace in name only, which for generations has been used as a residence for the cardinal holding the office of arch-priest of St. Peter's.

He holds almost absolutely aloof from all discussion and interference with the foreign relations of the holy see, and restricts his actions exclusively to the congregations (as the various departments of the pontifical administration are styled) of which he is either president or vice-president. These departments deal with matters of doctrine, dogma and internal administration of the church.

Though Rampolla holds thus aloof, he has remained a very notable figure. Every evening from sunset to 11 o'clock he receives visitors, and judging from the character of those who seek audience of him night after night, and from their number, it is very evident that they are convinced that he will yet live to play a great role in the history of the church.

At Rome, in ecclesiastical and political circles, it is thoroughly believed that the Emperor Francis Joseph, in causing the election of Rampolla to be vetoed at the conclave, acted not on his own initiative, but in compliance with the urgent request of Kaiser William.

## HAS BILL TO SAVE MEN FROM THE PEEK-A-BOO

Atlanta, Ga., July 14.—Woman's most cherished aids to self-beautification are threatened by a bill which has just been introduced in the State Legislature by George Glenn, representative for Whitfield County, who seeks to throw around man all the safeguards possible against the allurements of women.

His bill, if passed, will prevent the dissolution so common after marriage when the husband discovers that half of his wife's hair is a rat, her form made lovelier by the deft use of pads, and her complexion enriched by the use of paint and powder.

So long as a woman chooses to remain single she will, under the Glenn bill, have a right to use all the aids to beauty she desires, and to exert her blandishments upon the more susceptible sex at will.

If she wants to get married, however, she must appear as she really is. For the measure provides that should a woman marry a man, she must discard through the use of pads, powders, cosmetics, artificial teeth, padding, drop-stitched hose, high-heeled shoes, corsets, V-cut waists, lingerie or peek-a-boos, the marriage will be declared null and void.

The bill was referred by the speaker to the committee on ways and means, where it will receive careful consideration. It is understood that pressure is being brought to bear upon the members by their wives to amend the measure considerably.
