GRAND RIVER.—Increase, thirty-seven.—This Mission has, by God's blessing on the combined labours of his servants, made definite advancement. Many souls have been converted, and all are encouraged to look for still greater things.

WALSINGHAM.—Very likely and acceptable agents have been appointed on this Mission, and persevering labours have been applied, but the Station has not advanced as expectation would warrant ; still the brethren are disposed to hope, and believe on. May they soon see glorious fruit, as the reward of *united* and patient toil.

GUELPH.—This is one of the oldest of our Missions, and is stationary in relation to membership ; yet here hope is revived, as providence is opening the way in the erection of a new church, which will give more scope and opportunity to reach unsaved souls. May the plans for enlargement and success be crowned with God's special benediction.

GALT.—To give this place every advantage the Conference can render, this Mission is incorporated with Blenheim ; and we hope this arrangement the coming year God will bless to the Society and preaching places with which Galt is connected.
