

## ARTICLE VI.

**Of the Special Meetings of the Society.**

The President, or, in his absence, the officer highest in rank who may be in the city, shall, when any emergency occurs which in his opinion may render it expedient, or upon application made for that purpose by the Board of Managers, or by the Standing Committee hereafter mentioned, call a special meeting of the Society. The Secretary shall give due notice by advertisement and circular to the resident members, nine of whom shall be required to constitute a quorum. Special meetings shall be only competent for the transaction of the business for which they are called, and the consent of two-thirds of the members present shall be necessary to constitute a vote, and the yeas and nays on each question shall be recorded.

## ARTICLE VII.

**Of the Anniversary Assembly.**

As the benevolent views of the Society will be greatly promoted by social intercourse among the members, the Society shall hold an Anniversary Assembly, and such members as may be thereunto disposed shall meet together on St. Andrew's Day, and the members shall on that day appear with a St. Andrew's cross, or a thistle, displayed on the left breast. When St. Andrew's Day falls on a Sunday the first day of December shall be observed as the festival.

## ARTICLE VIII.

**Of the Duty of the President.**

The President shall, when he is present, preside at all meetings of the Society, preserve order, put the question, and declare the decision. He shall call a special meeting of the Society when he shall judge it proper, or when applied to for
