

The Synod resolved that their cordial thanks be tendered to the Revd. John Roaf, the Minister, and to the Deacons and Trustees of the Congregational Church in this City, for the comfortable accommodation afforded by them, in their Church, to the Synod, during the present session.

The Synod agreed to record their thanks to the friends in Toronto for the Christian hospitality received at their hands by the Ministers and Elders of the Synod, during the meeting in Toronto.

The Synod appointed Dr. Burns, (convener,) Mr. Gale, Mr. Rintoul, and Mr. Elder, a Committee to make arrangements for Religious Exercises to be conducted at the opening of the Synod next year, and to notify these through the Record, also to prepare a scheme for the ordering of the business of the Synod, and submit the same at the first session.

The Synod agreed that the next meeting shall be held at Toronto, on the third Wednesday of June, 1849, to be opened with sermon by the moderator, at the hour of 7, P. M.

The Synod was closed with singing a part of the 122nd Psalm, prayer, and the apostolical blessing at half-past Ten, P. M.
