Eat for Dominion Is Important Matter

LONDON, Sept. 20.—The Daily Telegraph's diplomatic correspondent emphasizes the importance of the question of food supply as one of the major concerns of nations and says the situation which recently arose at Geneva cannot be regarded as isolated. "What possible objection can there be to giving the citizens what they ask, namely, an independent investigation?" he asks. "If there are valid reasons why it is, why do not the council state it? Why couldn't they insist upon an inside audit which will give them all the facts?" He has been said and written and thought, the council should be the first to defend themselves in favor of letting in the light.
