LEACOCK ON PROHIBITION

McGill Professor's Letter to the London Times—Writes of "Appalling Disaster."

(Canadian Press)
London, March 24.—Professor Stephen Leacock of McGill University, had a long letter yesterday in the Times, in which he discussed "the appalling disaster" which had overtaken the United States and Canada in prohibition. He spoke of the prohibitionists as now having entered into his kingdom, and contended that his enjoyment was merely the price of persecuting his fellow men. He further warned England that a similar crusade was coming to England and said: "The most serious warning is needed for the decent British people of any class who may be thinking of migrating to the United States and to the City of Prohibition." He will keep nothing but bitter regrets. Let them come instead to the spacious and hospitable province of Quebec.
