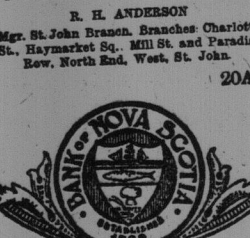

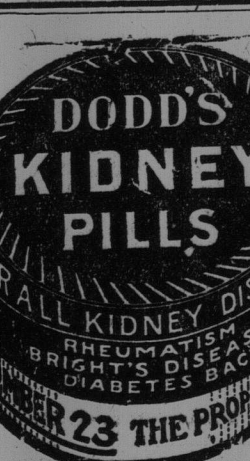

PRICES TAKE GREAT TUMBLE IN BERLIN

Berlin, July 15.—(By the Associated Press)—Prices on all foodstuffs have fallen with a crash in Berlin as a result of the lifting of the blockade. They began to show weakness when it was rumoured that the embargo would be lifted, but the real drop came only when it became known that the blockade was being lifted.

Twenty-five persons were injured when lightning struck a trolley car in Pittsburgh yesterday. The motorman was badly burned.

The North German-Lloyd liner Gotha, 6,653 tons, sank at Valparaiso Monday night.

A despatch from Cardiff, Wales, says that twenty-six persons are reported to have been killed in an explosion aboard the tanker Rosalea.
