- Q. 53 What do you mean by "their" orders?
- A. 53 Excuse me, I mean "these". (Pointing to Exhibit "1").
- Q. 54 What are they?
- A. 54 They are "Standing Orders for Veterans' Guard of Canada Escort details employed at labour projects".
- Q. 55 What else did you do? Will you continue?
- A. 55 I gave them an additional lecture on fraternization.
- Q. 56 What did you tell them? Will you tell the Court briefly?
- A. 56 I told them the importance of not only not fraternizing with Prisoners of War but also of not allowing any civilians or outsiders of any kind to fraternize with them.
- Q. 57 Where was the accused sent at that time or shortly afterwards? Where did he go?
- A. 57 He went to Thuro, Quebec.
- Q. 58 How many went with him?
- A. 58 Three privates, Sir, went with him.
- Q. 59 What rank was the accused at that time?
- A. 59 He was a "corporal" at that time.
- Q. 60 Who was in charge of the detail?
- A. 60 Corporal Lee, the accused, Sir.
- Q. 61 Where did they go?
- A. 61 They were to go to the Singer Sewing Machine Company project at Thuro, Quebec.
- Q. 62 What were they to do there?
- A. 62 They were to take over the guarding of prisoners of war from the previous company detachment.
- Q. 63 How many men were to remain at this project in such capacity?
- A. 63 The whole detachment, consisting of one W.O.C. and three privates.
- Q. 64 And while there, who was to be in charge of the detachment?
- A. 64 Corporal Lee, Sir.
