AT THE CAPITAL

The Work of Parliament Yesterday. Ottawa, Feb. 20.—Mr. Speaker took the chair at three o'clock and the house sat with closed doors for a considerable time.

Mr. Mackenzie Bowell, in answer to Mr. Weldon of St. John, said there had been received in export duty for logs during the year ending 31st July, 1889, \$56,750 from Ontario, \$16,945 from Quebec, and \$1,017 from New Brunswick.

Hon. C. H. Tupper, in answer to Mr. Kirk, said it was not the intention of the government to revise the regulations so as to permit fishing for the salmon lobsters in autumn of this year on the southern and eastern coast of Nova Scotia.

Sir John Thompson, in answer to Mr. Jones of Halifax, said the appointment to the bench of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia to fill the vacancy caused by the death of the late Justice Smith would be made at an early date.

Hon. C. H. Tupper, in answer to Mr. Eisenbater, said it was not the intention of the government to re-appoint Mr. Langelier, who had resigned his position as a member of the Legislative Council, to the bench of the Supreme Court.

It is now time that Mr. Fielding, Mr. Longley and the other men who compose this government should be relegated to private life, and that a good Conservative administration, working in harmony with the Dominion government, and devoted to the improvement of the material interests of the people, should be formed.

We have great hopes of the future of Nova Scotia, now that it seems probable that it will have no more Grit governments for many years to come.

THE GERMAN ELECTIONS. The result of the elections for the Reichstag in Germany has been rapidly announced.

The Liberal and Socialistic elements in Germany are rapidly obtaining the ascendancy. The government, organized as it is, will be unable to carry out its policy.

The Socialists have done very well in the election, and it is generally admitted to have a very considerable gift of demagoguery.

That a country, mainly devoted to lumbering, which had the offer from the government of the Surveyor Generalship and a substantial reduction of stamp duties, should reject both in order to gratify Mr. Thaddeus Stevens, Messrs. Alward and Stockton, and the directors of the Sun Publishing Co. very absurdly, it is never safe to predict that the people will vote in accordance with their own interests.

It is quite clear, however, that there is such a wide divergence between the views of the Liberals in Germany and those of the Conservatives, that no present coalition between them can be regarded as all likely to be permanent.

The German Liberals understand thoroughly well that the existence of an enormous army, as Germany has to maintain, and the power which is wielded by that army, are quite incompatible with free institutions in Germany.

Germany is at present dominated by the military element, and until this difficulty is removed it cannot hope to fall into line with such a nation as England, which, whatever power the aristocratic classes may wish, is now certainly as democratic as any nation in the world.

The elections in Germany will probably open the eyes of all parties to the fact that the present state of affairs is simply a compromise between absolutism and republicanism, and it does not take much wisdom to determine that the balance will lean when the people of Germany become alive to their own interests.
