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READS LIKE A ROMANCE.

At One Time Worth \$100,000 Now Dying in Poverty.

New York, Dec. 25.—The name of De Sisti, once known as the Napoleon of cigarette manufacturers, is dying penniless, in humble apartments at No. 143 West Tenth street. He is seventy-six years old. He was once worth \$100,000, and well known in many quarters, and the circumstances under which he now finds himself will surprise the old Spanish residents of this city and many Americans who were his friends when the old man was an active factor in the affairs of Cuba and Spain. He has many medals to testify to the honors he has received at the hands of foreign monarchs, and was appointed a Noble Grand Knight of the Apostolic Palace by the late Pope Pius IX. in recognition of his benevolence. His fortune, which was the result of his success in the tobacco business, and in recent years he has turned his attention to the introduction of American inventions into Cuba, with all financial success. De Sisti's life reads like a romance. The primary cause of his illness is a wound in his leg, received in a duel when he was twenty years old. The fall from his antagonist, in Havana, struck a tree, and clanking lodged in his leg, but did not make a wound that gave him the slightest trouble until six months ago. Since then erysipelas has developed, and bronchitis, which De Sisti was seized, grew into pneumonia, and he was unable to get up for several weeks, until his physician, a week ago, gave him only twenty-four hours to live.

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More Women and Children put to Death than Were Reported.

Berlin, Dec. 25.—The Cologne Gazette publishes a letter from Ararat, telling of fresh horrors there, including 25 villages laid in ashes and 11 other villages pillaged and 40 priests massacred. The letter says that the Turkish gendarms at Ezeroun, Iria, Van, Tigranocerta, Babert, and Moch, altogether about 60,000 men were sent against the Armenians. The commanders of these troops announced to the inhabitants of the villages: "We are ordered to get you to the woods for openly defying the government." The attack began on Aug. 18. The Turks were repulsed in the first instance. The massacres began Sept. 10th. Those Armenians who submitted unconditionally, were bound to stakes and their limbs cut off with axes. In other cases the men were dismembered and their eyes gouged out. Children were thrown into burning oil and women were tortured and burned to death. The corpses, ghastly and burned, the churches.
