GREAT BRITAIN'S NAVY ESTIMATES

Expenditure of \$203,018,500, an Increase Over 1909

Five Armored Ships, Five Cruisers, 20 Destroyers and Submarines—Plan for Retort of Lords Monday.

LONDON, Mar. 9.—The navy estimates for 1910, which were issued by the admiralty tonight, provide for an expenditure of £203,018,500, an increase of £2,865,000 over 1909.

The estimates further provide for an increase of 3,000 men in the personnel of the navy and the completion during 1910, of two floating docks to accommodate the largest battleships.
