

THE AMERICAN EXPLORING EXPEDITION.

SIR JOHN FRANKLIN.

The intrepid navigator, Sir John Franklin, if alive, says the Journal of Commerce, will soon enter upon his seventh winter in the Arctic regions.

As an illustration of how easily life may be sustained in these latitudes, Surgeon Kane mentions that he fell in with a walrus over seventy years of age, who had spent fifty-five years of his life north of 73° N.

Although the expedition has not been successful in the object for which it sailed, the effort is creditable to the humanity of the age, and should be continued until all hope is extinguished.

The vessels of this expedition were within about seven hundred miles of the supposed position of the Enterprise and Investigator, the two vessels which entered into the same sea on the opposite side of this continent, through the straits between it and Asia.

The rapid approach of winter forced the squadron to seek for winter-quarters, and they attempted to do so; but the ice gradually formed about them when off Wellington Channel, and on the 13th September, 1850, they were completely fastened in.

The drift was frequently to the westward of ten miles per hour, and occasionally the vessels would be carried near to bold and rocky promontories, from which there was much danger.
