



The lack of abundant capital resources restricts expenditure for improvement and equipment to some extent and has its part in the present subsidence of demand for mat-erials. The stock market flouidation which has been effected is calculated to correct that condition and provide a better demand for new capital is-sues. The violence of the later fall in prices of stocks aroused the suspicion that it was countenanced by the large capitalist groups for the purpose of fresh accumulation of securities dis-tributed at last year's higher prices.
