MOTORS AND PLANES.

Aeroplane manufacturers regret that until such time as motor houses are prepared to specify definite prices and dates of delivery it will be impossible to quote exact rates for pleasure and business planes. Catalogues of 1919-20 models now to hand call attention to the attractive features of the different makes, suggest improvements which will appear in 1920 designs, discuss the comfort of the accommodations provided, power capacity of the various types of engines, speed, the quality of the upholstery, etc., exactly along the line of the automobile advertisements which have been so familiar for years. The only uncertainty in the matter of price, due to the inability of the upholsterer, etc., exactly borders within a reasonable time or at contract rates.

The joys of air gliding, the varied pleasures of trans-Atlantic jaunts, the pleasure of week-end aviation all within reach of persons of moderate means, are most enticingly set forth in these catalogues, with of course the assumption that flying has already been accepted as a commonplace mode of travel and source of pleasure. All of this sounds a little strange at the present time, but it may confidently be predicted that during the next three or four years aeroplane advertising in newspapers and magazines will be just as familiar as automobile display is at present.

Indeed even now comparisons which have been made between the cost of motoring and of aeroplaning are full of interest in that the facts set forth tend to do away with the impression that flying is beyond the reach of any but the very wealthy. While it is not yet possible to buy an aeroplane at the cost of a Ford, yet more than a half built in Canada can be purchased for \$2,500, and fast two-seaters of the best American manufacturers are generally sold at \$7,500. Between these two prices there is a rather remarkable variety of designs from which the prospective purchaser may make his selection. It is clear that a reliable and serviceable plane may be bought for an amount not exceeding that now demanded for a high-class car. And when running expenses are considered, the differences in favor of the automobile are not so great. An ordinary motor car will travel twenty miles on a gallon of gasoline, a larger car probably not more than twelve miles. The ordinary two-seater airplane requires eight gallons of gasoline per hour and with a speed of one hundred miles it will thus burn not more than a half motor car. The aeroplane engine being highly complicated requires more oil, than does the ordinary motor, but will run one hundred and fifty miles to the gallon as against two hundred miles by a motor car of corresponding price. In the matter of repairs—the aeroplane must be overhauled after not more than fifty hours of flying, which overhauling will cost from two hundred to two hundred and fifty dollars. A motor car after travelling equal miles will need a new set of tires at practically the same cost as is involved in overhauling an aeroplane. Although no manufacturers are inclined to guarantee their planes against collapse, statistics show that one death occurs among pilots in training for every thirty-two hundred hours of flying, and over a speed of from seventy to eighty miles per hour. It would thus seem that an airman in training, not an expert, is killed for every two hundred and forty thousand miles of travel. An automobile to cover the same distance and running seventy-five miles per day would be on the road for ten years. The element of danger, therefore, is not so great as war casualties would lead one to suppose.

There are today thousands of trained men in Canada and the United States ready to accept positions as pilots, and thousands of others who are expert aero mechanics. These may be engaged at salaries not any higher than now paid chauffeurs. The chief difficulty in the way of popularizing aviation is that of securing accommodation for the machines and suitable landing places within easy reach. So that until aero clubs are organized and government assistance is enjoyed in the promotion of these prospective private owners will hesitate to purchase.

THE U. S. EFFORT.

The war department of the United States has issued its official report covering the part that country played in the European conflict. Briefly, the war cost \$21,850,000,000, or approximately \$1,000,000 per hour, of which amount two-thirds went for army expenses. The total armed strength of the country when the armistice was signed was 4,800,000 men, of whom 4,000,000 were in the army and the remainder in the marine corps and other branches. There were sent overseas 2,968,000 men, of whom 1,390,000 saw actual service. Portions of the army were engaged in thirteen major military operations. Participation in action resulted in 50,000 deaths, with 236,000 wounded, while 57,000 died of

disease. The number of men registering for service under the draft was 24,234,081, of whom there were drawn 2,810,256. The overseas army was transported, 1,037,000 or 49 per cent., by British Mercantile Marine; 327,000 or 43 per cent., by United States owned or controlled tonnage; 85,000 or 3 per cent., by Italian vessels; 47,000 or 2 per cent., by French vessels, and 37,000, or 1 per cent., by Russian ships operated by the British Admiralty. Four-two divisions were included in this overseas army, consisting of about one thousand officers and twenty-two thousand men each, while twelve other divisions were in training at home and four more were being organized when the end of the war came. Of those sent over, the majority sailed from New York, approximately one-half landed in France and the other half in England. Of the forty-two divisions reaching France twenty-nine were in action, this army holding one hundred and one miles of line, or twenty-five per cent. of the Western battle front. In the battle of St. Mihiel, 555,000 Americans were engaged, while in the Meuse-Argonne fighting, lasting forty-seven days, 1,200,000 participated.

This report by means of diagrams clearly indicates the comparative expenditures and losses of the nations engaged, showing, among other things, that the United States casualties were smaller than those of any other countries excepting Greece and Portugal, and were insignificant compared to those of Russia, Germany, France, Britain, Austria and Italy. Russia is credited with 1,700,000 battle deaths, Germany 1,600,000, France 1,335,000, Britain 900,000, Austria 800,000, and Italy 462,000. In expenditure the effort of the United States was proportionately far more than that of any other nation, as the American Republic paid out more than \$22,000,000,000, against \$26,000,000,000 by France, \$28,000,000,000 by Britain, and \$39,000,000,000 by Germany.

THE BRITISH STEAM ROLLER.

After all there is something solid and satisfying about the manner in which the British Government pursues the staid and even tenor of its way without regard to the advice of outside parties or objections from biased critics. There is, for example, the case of ex-Emperor William. Mr. Lloyd George originally submitted the proposal that this world criminal be brought to trial and compelled to undergo suitable punishment. This proposal was followed by an uproar on the part of the United States and several European countries, and was received in chilling silence even by France and Italy. Britain paid no attention to outside opinion, but in course of time when reference was again made to the matter it was found that the majority of the Allied countries were in hearty accord with the suggestion. Since then there has been widespread discussion, countless objections have been put forward, cranks of all nations have published their views, and critics have seized the opportunity to storm against this act of alleged inhumanity. But Lloyd George's government takes no heed. In a quiet, deliberate way plans have been prepared and the past few days have brought the announcement that an international tribunal will meet in England for the trial of the culprit. On top of this comes the report, evidently from Berlin, and later contradicted, that Holland will not surrender the ex-Emperor, that guards surrounding his residence have been doubled, and that the country in which he finds sanctuary will by every means in its power oppose whatever action the Allies may take to secure possession of him. Possibly despatches of this nature are necessary to keep the news mills going, but when the time arrives we will hear from the proper sources in London of a demand for the surrender of the ex-Emperor, which Holland will be unable to disregard of the time and place of trial, of the personnel of the tribunal, and the charges against the prisoner. And in due course evidence will be taken, a verdict reached and sentence imposed. The steam roller of British justice moves quietly but without pause.
