

BAXTER RIPS FOSTER RULE INTO SHREDS

Opposition Leader at Fredericton Reviews Manifesto of Premier in Merciless Style.

Mr. Veniot and the Government speakers took great credit to themselves for the work done on the roads. It was true they had made some improvement but some of the roads in York county could be classed as permanent and there never should have been a bond issued to do this class of work.

John A. Young
Mr. John A. Young, who has represented the constituency for the past 13 years, thanked the electors for the support given him in the past. He had always acted in the best interests of his constituents and he would do the same while he was expected to represent them on the floors of the Legislature.

When he first became a member of the Legislature the revenue of the province was only about \$1,000,000 while last year it was \$2,400,000 and yet with all that they had expended the province to the amount of \$2,100,000 the roads and run up deficits amounting to over \$300,000. In spite of all this the roads in the County of York were not a bit better than they were in 1918.

The Stumpage Rates

In the year 1918 he had asked them to increase the stumpage rate to \$5.50 per thousand and this would have wiped out their deficits and given them a surplus. He had always considered the big operators should pay the same stumpage as the small operators and if they were treated that way a much larger revenue could be expected.

Hon. Mr. Baxter

Then Mr. Baxter was then called on by the chairman and on his rising he was given a hearty reception. He expressed his pleasure at having an opportunity to address an audience in York. He saw before him an excellent body of voters. This body of voters would on Saturday exercise their right to say by the ballot who should control the affairs of this province. It was the duty of every person who had a vote to use it and before using it to inform themselves of the issues of the day. It was in his mind that those who did not use the franchise should possibly have the right taken away from them.

It was the duty of all the people to go to the polls and record their votes and not wait for the candidates to speak up enthusiastically. When the day came that all voters did their duty in this matter there would not be the same predisposition to understand means in political campaigns.

Premier Foster's Manifesto

Mr. Foster had issued a manifesto in which he stated great many things. Dealing with the manifesto Mr. Baxter took it up then by theme. They were now claiming they had given the franchise to women.

That the government had seen a light and introduced a bill to extend the franchise to women. The bill was so badly drawn that it would not have conferred the franchise on all women and he had to help them put it in proper shape.

The only credit which could be claimed by the government was that they had changed their minds in regard to votes for women.

The Compensation Act

Regarding the Workmen's Compensation Act. Long before the Premier Government came into being there had been Workmen's Compensation legislation and the present act was only the result of evolution along these lines.

The old government had amended the acts dealing with these matters and then had appointed a commission to study the question and draw a bill. This was done, and it was on the report of this commission that the present law was modeled. All the government could claim credit for was in having enough sense to take advantage of a good thing when it came their way. The act needed some further amendments, and he and his party were prepared to give further study to this matter and broaden it in certain respects.

The Independent Audit

The Independent Audit Act was another thing for which they claimed a great deal of credit. One of the provisions of the bill required the signature of the provincial secretary to every cheque, and this signature was affixed by a rubber stamp. They claimed a lot in connection with agriculture. They talked about grants to better and abuse factories, but these

were first given by the old government. Every item in their list was inflated by the former administration. The whole agriculture department was organized under Hon. Mr. Landry and Mr. Murray.

They had introduced two new things. They had bought some good wheat which had to be cleaned before it could be sold to the farmers. This resulted in an expense of about \$5,000. Mr. Tweeddale had also imported some "scrub" sheep, of which, no doubt, he was very proud, but the farmers who purchased them from the department certainly were not satisfied.

Trim Health Act

Another thing they patted themselves on the back about was the Health Act. There were some things about the Health Act that were good; some of them were mere useless trills, and could well be cut out. When the Opposition were returned to power, and this would be on October 3 next, they intended to trim off from the Health Act the useless trills and leave the things which were of real benefit to the community.

Mr. Foster was calling attention to trumpet tones to his hydro-electric power development policy. So far this was only talk, and nobody yet knew, except the executive, what was in the report on the proposed development.

There was no question in anyone's mind of the necessity for the development of the water powers of the province. When the Opposition was elected, it would proceed to develop the water powers along sane and economical lines. There were certain water powers in the province which could be developed, but this work would be proceeded with only after the most careful investigation by competent engineers.

Dr. Baxter addressed two meetings during the evening, one at the Knights of Pythias Hall in Marysville, and the other in the Opera House here. At the Marysville meeting the chair was occupied by Mayor Walker, and at the Opera House the chairman was Mayor John A. Reid, of Fredericton.
