BLACK GOODS! By Telegraph. Canadian, British and Foreign. [ To the Associated Press. ] LONDON, July 11. Black Baratheas. Eleven of the Canadian party have been successful in the first stage of the prize shooting at Wimbledon, Eng. NEW YORK, July 11. A large fire occurred at Weehawken, N. 


