There are many thirgs which he said about the time of his departure, which constrains us to say with one of old, "Let nie die the death of the righteous, and let my last end be like his."

On the Friday following his body was committed to the grave, and an appropriate discourse was delivered on the occasion, by the Rev. James Richardson, from Psalm xxxvii, 37, "Mark the perfect man and behold the upright, for the end of that man is peace."
