The society has in many ways been making a "Christian Endeavor" to sow good seed. The extent of our influence we will never fully know till the great Harvest time, when we will hope and pray that there may be many sheaves from this portion of our Lord's vineyard.

We would close our report with an earnest invitation to all the young people of the church to come to our meetings, join our society and blend their efforts with ours, so that while we are grateful for all that has been done, we may go forward doing and hoping for still better things.
