An Act respecting the Sureties of Public Officers on the Separation of United Counties and Townships.

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend the Law with respect to Public Preamble.

Officers of United Counties or Townships, who continue the public officers of the senior County or Township, or remaining Counties or Townships after the separation of a junior County or Township from 5 the Union, and with respect to the Sureties of such Public Officers,

Therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- 1. The separation of a Junior County or Township from a Union of Separation Counties or Townships, shall not in any case or in any manner whatnot to affect the duties or 10 ever affect the office, duty, power or responsibility of any Public Officiability of an cer of the Union who continues a public officer of the senior County officer contour the sureties of any such Officer or their liability, further than by County, ac., limiting such office duty, power, responsibility, suretyship, and liability or his sure
 15 to the senior County or Township, or remaining Counties or Townships.
- 2. All such public Officers shall, after such separation, be the officers Such officers of the senior County or Township, or remaining Counties or Townships, to be the officers if they had originally been respectively appointed Public Officers Senior county. 20 for such senior County or Township, or for such remaining Counties or &c.

 Townships only.
- 3. All surcties for such Public Officers shall be, and remain liable, Liability of as if they had become the surcties for such Public Officers, in respect their surcties only of such senior County or Township, or of such remaining Coun-25 ties or Townships.
 - 4. Nothing herein contained shall affect the right of new sureties Right to rebeing required to be given by any Sheriff, or by any Clerk or Bailiff quirenew sureties not or other public officer, under any statute, or otherwise howsoever.
 - 5. This Act shall apply to Upper Canada only.

Act limited to U. C.
