

The Western Extension College and Its Work



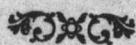
THE Western Extension College provides complete instruction for all examinations conducted by the Department of Education up to and including Grade XII. In this branch of educational work the College possesses an extensive, successful and honorable record which is without parallel in the history of correspondence instruction. The increasing prestige enjoyed by the College is the result of sound, capable management, well-planned, well-directed courses of study, experienced, conscientious instructors and an ambitious student-body.

The whole of the work of the College is conducted through the medium of the post. Distance is no impediment to effective service. Students work in their own homes, in spare time, and without interfering with their present employment.

Candidates are recommended to commence their work early in order to make their preparation failure-proof. Where, however, rapid coaching is essential, the College prepares students in the shortest possible time and with the maximum prospects of success.

As an indication of what may be accomplished by the earnest student, it may be stated that every W.E.C. trained candidate who sat for the complete Grade XII examination (first class) in 1924, was successful. The period of preparation varied from six to nine months. These successes, without exception, were obtained by students working through the regular home-study courses in spare time and, in every case, at the first time of sitting.
