Dear Sir: Re Mackenzie v Carlyle

Since writing you on the 9th inst.,  
I have received a report from Messrs. Dun & Bradstreet  
of Canada Ltd. on John Logan Carlyle which reads as  
follows:

"As far as can be determined, Mr. Carlyle  
has never been a permanent resident in Vancouver but  
has spent short periods in the City. The last time  
he was here, was during the summer of 1934. He is a  
blacksmith by trade, aged about 50 and married. He  
is reported to have followed his trade at Oakland,  
California and also operated an express business there.  
It is also understood that he gave financial backing  
to a large automobile concern in Los Angeles. He is  
reported to have considerable real estate holdings  
in California and to be a man of some means. He has  
stated to informants in Vancouver that on account of  
failing health he gave up active participation in  
business and has since spent his time in touring  
about the world. To the knowledge of informants  
here, he is the type of man that has always handled  
his obligations in a satisfactory manner. Inform-  
ants here are not able to supply an address for him  
at the present time but it is their understanding  
that he is not now in Australia."
