

they became resident in the Union after that date and before the commencement (31st May, 1928) of the Union Nationality and Flags Act, 1927, (Act No. 40 of 1927), or are deemed to be Union nationals if they became resident in the Union after 31st May, 1928, but before the commencement of Act No. 14 of 1932 (19th May, 1932), or became Union nationals by becoming resident in the Union after the 19th May, 1932.

This Act was brought in force to provide British and Union nationality for those persons who, being burghers, may not have become British subjects by annexation, through absence from the territories in question at the time of annexation and for some years subsequently.

(5) MANDATED TERRITORY OF SOUTH WEST AFRICA.

Act no. 30 of 1924.

(A) In the Mandated Territory of South West Africa, the South West Africa Naturalisation of Aliens Act, 1924 (Act No. 30 of 1924), passed by the Union Parliament, made the Naturalisation of Aliens Act, 1910 (Act No. 4 of 1910), effective in the Territory, which for the purposes of the Act was considered to form part of the Union.

Act No. 30 of 1924 provided that every adult European who, being a subject of any of the late enemy Powers, was on 1st January, 1924, or at any time thereafter before the commencement of the Act (15th September, 1924) domiciled in the territory, should, at the expiration of six months after the latter
