

credited on the sale renders it quite out of order to regard this as a new sale, and to give the settler the privilege of cutting timber for sale on 15 acres free of dues.

A license to cut timber in clearing land for cultivation may be issued, but the dues payable thereon should be collected and credited as part payment of the lot.

If the settler feels any interest in paying the several instalments, so many years past due, he would be glad to obtain a license on these terms.

As regards the case of Joseph M. Robb, the objection to issue a license to Mr Robb was that he only acquired Lot 8, Con. 11, C. P. R. Eastern by assignment
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
