
Ottawa, 30th January, 1907.

Sir:-

Referring to your letter of the 28th November last (No. 126) I have to request you to ascertain whether the Muscowequan Band will surrender, and upon what terms, the northwest quarter of Sec. 6 (Tp. 27. R. 14) or that portion of the said quarter- section north of the railway track.

It is to be understood and considered in connection with the desired surrender that if it is given the ordinary road allowances to the north and south boundaries of the reserve may be opened for the use of the public; but not at the expense of the Indians.
