(4) State if the ground is level, and if not, give the approximate height at each corner of the proposed site, stating also if site will admit of any cellar or basement rooms for any purpose, particularly the heating plant as shown on the plan submitted, stating if accommodation is sufficient.


(5) State whether coal or wood is to be used, and if coal, whether hard or soft, coking or non-coking, giving the name of the mine and the approximate cost. This information is necessary that a type of boiler suitable may be specified.

(6) State if the stone there quarries readily and is suitable for the stone-work or if concrete walls will be more economical.

(7) The ground from the school site to river falls rapidly; is this sufficiently free from rock to permit a septic tank working satisfactorily? State also if ground is of clay or sandy nature.

The information sent should be as full as possible so that the preliminary plans may be completed before being sent you for inspection, and will prevent delay in the filing, and should be forwarded with the least possible delay.
