Sir,

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter 427. C.2. dated 28th. Sept. 1892 having reference to the land taken for right of way through the Spallumcheen and Okanagan Indian Reserves by the Spalumcheen and Okanagan Railway Co. and covering a letter on that subject from the Indian Department at Ottawa asking for my further report thereon.

I beg to state that in making my report of the 26th. May 1891 I represented to the best of my ability, the nature of ground taken for right of way, by the aforesaid Railway Company, my valuation of the lands taken, and my reasons for making said valuation: which valuation I considered as being equivalent to the value of the land plus any detriment to the Reserves which might arise, from the direction in which the line of Railway cut through them. I have now to add that no improvements on the Reserves are injuriously affected by the locating of said right of way
