They asked for no further lands or concessions, except that they be allowed to share in the compensation that may be obtained through the activities of the Allied Tribes now recognized by the Government, although they were not disposed to press the matter or embarrass the Government against whom they had no complaints, the Government having always treated them with fairness and equity.

They would like to see a boarding school in the North, operated and controlled by the Government and non-sectarian.

They expressed thanks for the additions made to their reserves as approved by the Royal Commission, their objection to the proposed cut-offs being in theinterests of the Indians of the future -their children.

They also thanked Rev.P.R.Kelly and Mr.Ambrose
Reid for the full explanations made and expressed confidence in
their ability to represent their views to the Conference to
be held in Vancouver in November. At the same time they would
like to be kept posted as to developments.
