Meeting with the Seten Lake Band or Tribe of Indians on Thursday,

November 5th. 1914, at Seten Lake I.R.

JOR DE SHIELDS is sworn to act as Interpreter.

MR COMMISSIONER MACDOWALL explains to the assembled Indians as to the scope and purpose of the Commission, and

CHIEF PRIMR addresses the Commission as follows:

I am very pleased to see you gentlemen - I am very glad and welcome you here - I am the Chief. I am the last one for two of the Chiefe died before me and I am all alone new, and I am looking after these two places - I am net very streng and they teld me to be Chief. I pray to Ged to help me, but I cannot see Ged - I cannot see him because he has no bedy. Well the people now have a bedy and I can see you fellows - I am raised among whites. When the first whites came to this country I was a little fellow and they seemed to mike me until new. New you people 5 of you, I hope you will like me, but I guess semeone sent you up here to settle the grievances - may be the Almighty God sent you up here to settle my grievances; that is why you follows at'nt going to laugh at my words. I am glad to see you follows come hore - May be you are my children -I am ever 60 years old - Before the whites came there were no houses and they lived on one Reserve. The Indians they have not got any land or cultivation and still they keep their water to drink that was the condition of the Indians. Our eld ferefathers are all gone and we are new living on . our own land and are looking after it - That is why we are saying we are the original inhabitants of the land. (He here preduces map showing his Reserves) I am pointing out on the map where the Indians had trouble about their land on No.1. When the surveyors came to measure up this land, when they got down to the N.W. corner they asked me if the line will go through this way (indicating on map) will it take all the land in that you will require and I said that might take in all the land that I will require, so they run that line through, and when they went through we found that we did net get the place that me wanted and I told the surveyor
