### ***The Woman's Missionary Society***

An item of interest when recalling former days is the fact that to Centenary Church was given the honour of being the place where the Women's Missionary Society of the Methodist Church had its origin. The desirability and need of such a Society having been recognized by the General Conference, an appeal, under its authority, was made June 7th, 1880, by Rev. Dr. Sutherland, Secretary of the Board of Missions, before a company of Methodist women. This resulted in an Auxiliary being formed June 23rd in Centenary Church, with an enrollment of Thirty-three members, drawn from the various Methodist Churches of the city. During the year other Auxiliaries arose in several cities and towns culminating in an organization embracing the whole of Canada with the addition of Newfoundland and Bermuda. Of this wider organization, Mrs. Dr. Burns was the first President; Mrs.
