THE COLONIAL BUILDING is an imposing structure of white limestone, quarried in the immediate neighborhood, with a frontage of three hundred feet. Its spacious verandahs and balconies especially appeal to the visitor whose impression is heightened on entering the fine rotunda and handsome reception rooms. The special features in evidence here for the treatment, care and protection of the patients are in close harmony with the most advanced ideas in psychiatry. The Colonial Building, which has a south aspect, is devoted to the care of those quiet patients whose cases are under a special observation to determine the exact course of treatment their individual cases require. It will be readily understood that an efficient staff of nurses is maintained here, nurses who have quiet voices and sympathetic hearts, and who are capable of making an intelligent reading of the conflicting indices offered by the newly arrived patient.
