DEFEATED TURKISH TROOPS. Ohhrida District the Scene of Hard Fighting.

Berlin, April 4-A despatch from Constantinople to The Lokal Auzeiger, dated yesterday, announces thato the Bulgarian bands and Turkish troops in the Okhrida district have fought pattle, and that 1,000 men were killed or wounded.

Constantinople, April 4.—Official advices from Monastir say the Bulgarian nhabitants of thirty villages in the Okhrida district, totalling three thousand men, and supported by the Bisand men, and supported by the bring hop and a number of revolutionary pands, have risen against the Turks. They surrounded a small detachment of Turkish troops in the mountains orthward of Okhrida, but the troops succeeded in cutting their way out, after sustaining considerable loss.

Another dynamite outrage at the Fown of Mustapha Pacha has led to the discovery that the revolutionary committee is supposed to be responsible for the attempt to wreck the Oriental Express early in the morning of March 31, when the bridge of the Turkish Oriental Railroad, between Adrianopole and Mustapha Pacha, was blown up by an infernal machine.

Although affairs at Mitrovitsa and Prishtina are reported to be calmer, the rising of the Armenians in those districts creates intense concern at the palace, among the Ministers, and at the Embassies. It is felt that a continuation of the troubles in the vicinity of Novi-Bazar is liable to lead at any moment to an extension of Austrian occupation over the entire district, and as far as thre district, and as far as Mitrovitsa, although it is believed nothing short of absolute necessity will induce Austria to take advantage of this right, which is reserved to her by the treaty of Berlin.

A CRISIS IN FRANCE.

ATTITUDE OF CONGREGA-TIONS CAUSES ANXIETY.

Statement by Premier Combes Police Insisting Upon Religious Orders Closing Their Estab-

Paris, April 4.-Premier Co mbe, anweging an interpellation of M. Rudelle (Liberal Republican) in the Chamber of Deputies to-day, as to why he did not intend to accompany President Loubet on the latter's coming trip to Algeria, said the real reason was the threatening, violent attitude of the congregations. He added that there was no mistaking the manner in which the friends of the congregations and the congregations themselves had received the action of the Chamber in voting to expel the latter from France. They were openly talking of violent resistance. Under such circumstances the leaders of the Left party had requested him not to absent himself from Paris. It was with great regret that he gave up the pleasure of accompanying the President, but he regarded it as being his duty to do so.

The Marists, Dominicans, Capuchins, Barnabites, Franciscans, Redemptorists, Oractorians and Brothers of the Sacratheart and of the Holy Cross also have been notified to disband.
