A village in the Township of Dunham, County of Missisquoi, pleasantly situated on a branch of the Yamaska River and South Eastern Division of the C. P. R. Has three churches, Episcopal, Methodist and Congregational, a graded school, carriage factory and grist mill, a branch of the E. T. Bank, a local newspaper, the *Observer*, and two furniture shops. Distance from Swetsburg, 1 mile; Dunham, 6 miles; East Farnham, 3 miles; Brigham, 6 miles; Montreal, 52 miles.
