Synopsis of Canadian North-West.

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even-numbered section of Dominon Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, ex-cepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homestended by any per-son who is the sole head of 8 family, or any male over is years of age, to the extent of ons-quarter section of 160 acres, more or leas.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy, may, however, be made at any Agency on certain condi-tions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES. - (1) At least six months' residence upon and cul-tivation of the land in each year for three years.

for three years. (2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not lees than eighty (80) acress in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint owner-shir in land will not meet this re-quirement. guirement.

quirement. (3) A homesteader, intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the klove while living with jarents or on farm-ing land owned by himself must notify the ascent for the district of such intention.
