Tranways and Power Company's Bill

passed its third reading this afternoon
by a vote of 18 to 12. One opposition

These were that the bill be given the three months' hoist; secondly, that it be amended so that it should not come into force till the expiration of the exclusive chains in the charter of the Halifax Electric Trainway Bill, which will be in September, 1916, thirdly, that the clause be strick out providing for the taking over of the Halifax Trainway property and franchise by the new power company.

The fourth amendment was that the bill be referred back to committee to be so amended that it should not come into force till it had been proclaimed by the Governor-in-Council, after taking a plebiscite vote of the citizens of the approval of a majority of stich vote. The last amendment, moved by Mr. Margeson, was designed to give the Provincial Government authority to take over, at a fair valuation, the works or work of the Nova Scotla Tramways and Power Company, whenever it should be found expedient in the public interest to do so.

This is a marked success for E. A. Robert and his associates who for two years have been seeking what they have now practically obtained.
