QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS. Miscellaneous.

HEN DIES—BIRDS DESTRUCTIVE.

1. Would you kindly tell me through your paper what is the matter with this hen? The hen was very lame, and when she walked she would drag her leg behind her; she ate well, but did not lay, and was healthy-looking. I killed her, and when I opened her she had a bunch growing on her back which resembled a gizzard, but was mattery on the inside. I immediately destroyed her.

2. Could you also tell me how to keep sparrows and blackbirds from destroying seed oats and seed timothy? We have a piece of timothy of three acres; the birds are simply destroying it all. F. P.

Ans.—1—This may have been a tumor, or it may have been tuberculosis. You were wise to destroy her, and it would be advisable to thoroughly disinfect the poultry house in which she was kept.

2. Considerable trouble of this kind has been reported this year. A liberal use of powder and shot is about the only method we know.

MATERIAL FOR SILO—WHEN TO PLOW TIMOTHY SOD FOR CORN.

1. Please give me bill of material required to build a cement silo 14 x 35, and thickness of wall?

2. Could the part under ground be erected this fall and the rest in the spring, by leaving iron rods sticking up to make good connections?


3. I have a piece of timothy sod in good condition for corn next year. It will get no manure. Would it be wise to leave it lie till the first of May before preparing for crop? R. G.

Ans.—1. We shall answer this question by reproducing the bill of material used for the cement-concrete construction of our silo at Weldwood, which is 14 x 40, with walls tapering in thickness from 11 inches at the bottom to 6 at the top. This is exclusive of the underground or foundation course 2½ feet deep, which is 18 inches thick at the bottom, tapered to 15 inches at the ground level. For the portion above ground, 10 inches, tapering to 6, would be plenty strong enough. We would advise you to make your silo not less than forty feet high. Depth is the most desirable feature in a silo, and in a cement silo it may easily be secured. If we were altering the proportions of our silo, it would be to make it still deeper, thus giving more capacity for summer feeding, while keeping surface of silage down to a minimum. However, if you do build only thirty-five feet high, estimate seven-eighths as much gravel and cement as we used. Following is our bill of material. Full particulars regarding construction may be found in our issue of February 1st, 1912.

Tile for drainage, 120 3-inch.....	1 56

2. The underground part might be built now as you suggest, and the rest in the spring, but we would not advise it. There would be a certain weakness in the wall at the critically important point where the junction would occur, and the underground portion would be too shallow to be of use until construction was completed. If necessary to have such a union of new and old work, we should prefer to have it come higher up the wall.

3. On general principles, we should answer this question for your locality in the negative, unless the field is a hilly one, or subject to excessive surface-washing.


