Terror Reigns

in Portugal

The King and Crown Prince Assassinated by Group of Armed Men.

Queen's Noble Act

Tries to Save King at Her Own Peril—Other Nations Send Ships to the Vicinity.

Lisbon, Portugal, Feb. 3.—The king and crown prince are dead and the king's second son is severely wounded as a result of an attack by revolutionists on the public streets here Saturday afternoon. King Carlos of Portugal and the Crown Prince Louis were riding in the carriage with the second son Manuel and the queen when the attack occurred. The three assassins were shot dead on the streets and a fourth who was captured committed suicide in prison. A reign of terror has been precipitated in Portugal.

An attempt was made on the life of Premier Franco this morning at an early hour. Revolutions surrounded his house and fired on the occupants. Their fire was returned and they were beaten off.

The royal family were returning from Villa Vicosa, the King's country estate where they have been sojourning. The carriage had arrived at the corner of Parado De Commercio, and Rua de Arsenal, when the assassins suddenly sprang towards the carriage, and leveling their carbines, which they had concealed on them, fired, mortally wounding the king and crown prince, and slightly wounding the king's second son. The queen very bravely sprang to her feet in the carriage and tried to shield the crown prince with her own body from the leaden messengers of death, but it was too late. The king fell backwards on the cushions almost at the first shot. The same moment the crown prince rose, then sank back on the seat dying. Two bullets struck Prince Manuel, one in the lower jaw and one in the arm. The carriage guard, recovering from the momentary astonishment which he had felt at the rescues, fired and shot down in their tracks and one was captured and placed in prison, where he killed himself a short time later.

With the sparks of life still fluttering in their bodies the king and prince were hastily conveyed to the marine arsenal nearby.

The king was dead when the arsenal was reached, and the prince expired almost immediately after his admission. The attack was directed on the king and crown prince and each was shot three times.

Queen Maria Pia, mother of the slain monarch, the Duke of Oporto, his brother, and a number of ministers of court and officials hastened at once to the arsenal when the news of the frightful attack upon the royal family reached them. Both victims were dead when they arrived. The bodies were removed from the arsenal in two closed carriages and taken to the royal palace, the late residence of the king. The carriages moved under an escort of the municipal guard. The tragedy occurred about 5.30 in the afternoon, and the panic instantly gripped the city and all activities were prostrated in the lines of communication. It was not for some hours that the news of the assassination was allowed to be sent broadcast. The cold blooded murderer sent a thrill of horror through the country, even among those who have been working heartily for the establishment of a republic. Sorrow was expressed on every side at the dreadful end of the king and the crown prince.

Concerning the homes of the suspected, secrecy is being maintained. Sunday night the government announced one of the assassins had been identified as Manuel Bulca, sergeant of the seventh regiment. He was about 30 years of age, and was for years a private tutor. His dead fellow conspirators are supposed to be Portuguese, but the police profess not to know whom.

Gibraltar, Feb. 3.—The British cruiser fleet sailed from Gibraltar this morning at an early hour. The destination is Lisbon and no announcement has been made as to the orders which the commodore has received from home.

Madrid, Spain, Feb. 3.—A warship of the Spanish fleet was despatched this morning for Lisbon where it will be placed under the orders of the Spanish ambassador.

SEED GRAIN

Will be Charge Against the Farmers—First Estimate Brought Down.

On Monday the estimates for seed grain for farmers of the western provinces were presented in the Dominion House.

The sum of \$2,850,000 is the first estimate though this sum may be increased. The amount is to be proportioned as follows:

1. To provide an amount to purchase seed grain for homestead settlers in the provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan, the cost of the said seed grain to be repaid by the settlers with interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum, until repayment to be a lien or charge upon the lands of settlers held under homestead entry—\$585,000.
2. To enable the government of Canada to advance the government of Alberta a loan for the purchase of seed for settlers—\$440,000.
3. To enable the government of Canada to advance to the government of Saskatchewan a loan for the purchase of seed grain for settlers—\$1,825,000.

THAW WAS ACQUITTED

On Account of Insanity, but Judge Ordered Him to be Sent to the Mattawan Asylum.

New York, Feb. 1.—Harry Thaw was acquitted of the murder of Stanford White shortly before noon today on the grounds of being insane at the time of the murder. Immediately after the jury returned the verdict Justice Dowling committed the prisoner to the asylum for the criminal insane at Mattawan, subject to his possible recovery.

The jury had been out twenty-five hours almost to a minute, and were said to have taken about a dozen ballots before reaching a verdict. When the verdict was announced pandemonium broke loose in the court room. Littleton asked Dowling to release the prisoner immediately, but the justice refused the request and a messenger was despatched to get Jerome, who was at his office.

Upon Jerome's arrival the request for Thaw's release was renewed, but Justice Dowling in reviewing the evidence thought that to allow Thaw at large would be a danger to the public safety as a recurrence of such outbreaks might take place.

Additional Locals

T. J. How has his coal mine south of Rouleau opened up and farmers nearby are securing coal at \$1.75 a load at the mouth of the mine. The coal is a lignite and is of good quality. It will require railway facilities to place it on the market to any extent.

At the meeting of the Dominion Shorthorn Breeders Association held in Toronto this week, Mr. Geo. Kinison, of Crowsfoot, was elected vice president for Saskatchewan. The association made, among other grants, \$400 towards a provincial fair for Saskatchewan at Regina.

The Regina Excelsior band held another successful concert and dance in the city hall last Wednesday evening. The hall was filled and everyone enjoyed themselves thoroughly. After the concert part refreshments were served and then dancing commenced and was kept up till three o'clock in the morning. The next dance is announced for Feb. 28.

The Winnipeg police egged on by the local branch of the Lord's Day Alliance took the names of over 300 persons in that city on Sunday who were supposed to be breaking the provisions of the Lord's Day Act. Amongst those whose names were taken were newspaper men, cab drivers, merchants, railway employees, druggists, newsboys, fruit vendors, restaurant keepers and even a minister who was performing a marriage ceremony.
