DEATH'S CALL

The death occurred on Saturday, at this home on Princess street, of Levi Anderson, at the advanced age of 72 years, six months and five days. The deceased was one of the most prosperous and respected colored residents of the city.

He was born in Nash County, North Carolina, May 5, 1834, and came to Canada in 1861, first settling in Pike Creek. One year later he came to Chatham, where he has resided ever since.

The late Mr. Anderson was a cooper by trade, conducting a business on the market for a number of years, and he had by thrift and industry become the owner of considerable valuable property in this city.

He is survived by a wife and a grown-up family. The children are Marcellus, Chatham; Mrs. M. Robinson, Chatham; Mrs. Samuel Smith, Woodstock, and Arabella at home.

The funeral will take place Tuesday afternoon at two o'clock to the B. M. church, and thence to Maple Leaf Cemetery.
