Geological Drive.

The Junior Class in Geology at Acadia,
in company with their instructor, Prof.
A. E. Caldwell, spent the afternoon of
Saturday last in a drive, in the pursuit
of their study. Places of geological in-
terest along the Ridge Road and through
the Gaspeau valley were visited and
specimens collected. In returning the
party passed through Horton Landing
where they visited the Acadia Villa in-
stitution and the other mem-
bers of the Faculty. This annual ge-
ological drive is a new departure at
Acadia but it is one which will prob-
ably be kept up and will henceforth
be another attraction of this already
very popular class.

The building occupied by the Tele-
phone Co. has been removed further
west and Mr Herbin is getting ready to
begin the construction of his new build-
ing on the corner of Main street and
Rand avenue. The cellar has been ex-
cavated and masons are now at work on
the foundation. The building will be
22 x 45 feet. It will be occupied by Mr
Herbin in his jewelry business, with the
second story fitted up for a dwelling.

Geo. Randall, of Aylesford, who has
considerable experience at fruit farming,
has this week given us a receipt for
killing borers in apple trees. His course
though simple has proved entirely effec-
tive and consists of inserting a common
shingle nail in the holes made by these
insects. Mr Randall has proved the
efficacy of this course of treatment by
repeated experiments, and in every case
his efforts have been attended with the
desired result, no instance of borers
being found in a tree treated in this
manner. He has also reported the
receipt to several of his neighbors, who
have used it in every case with satisfac-
tory results.—*Western Chronicle*.
