PARIS, July 9.—The United States was the victor in the Olympic trap-shooting events which ended today, piling up a score of 15 points. Hungary was second with 10, Finland third with 9, Canada fourth with 9, Belgium fifth with five, Sweden sixth with 2, Aus-tralia seventh with one.






